Southwest Freeway Construction Pushes East to 288 beginning 2020

The Big Dig is coming to Houston in 2020 when TxDOT will begin a 5 year project to extend the depressed section of the Southwest Freeway along BOCA"s northern boundary all the way to the 288 interchange. The project is part of the I-45 rebuild

and is currently in the planning stages. It includes rebuilding the connection to Spur 527 to improve traffic safety, and expanding the freeway to include additional lanes



from Mt. Vernon to 288. The Montrose Bridge will need to come down temporarily and will be rebuilt to span the increased freeway width. Most exciting of all is a proposal for a public/private partnership with All property owners and residents of Boulevard Oaks are Rice Univ. to place a deck with a park over the below grade freeway lanes from Main to San Jacinto. The



new park will serve as a connection from the Rice Campus to its new facility at the old Sears store. Rice also hopes to create safer pedestrian and bike routes connecting the main campus to the revamped Sears site. Beyond the 288 interchange, more exciting enhancements are planned, such as the elimination of the Pierce Elevated, public art and multimodal transportation options. Montrose Management District's Dissolution Impacts BOCA

A 6-year battle about the Montrose Management District has ended in the dissolution of the District that had once provided security patrols, esplanade beautification, and graffiti remediation north of US59. The District took care of bridge lighting repairs and ongoing maintenance.

Unfortunately, the fate of the US59 bridges is literally up in the air. Former District Executive Director Ben Brewer says that contracts for the electricity and maintenance are paid through the summer, but thereafter the bridges will go dark again unless another group steps up to adopt them. The absence of the District's patrols has been noticeable, with more commercial burglaries along the freeway and larger numbers of panhandlers and homeless encampments cropping up north of US59. Also, the Southampton/BOCA Patrol has had more calls concerning homeless persons, and has responded when they have attempted to camp overnight on the bridges.

We are monitoring the District's appeal of the recent order to repay \$6.6M in assessment. And we remain hopeful that a sponsor can be found to maintain the bridges' lights which have become a Houston landmark.

Incidentally, the construction of the arched bridges with their fiber optic lighting was due in large part to BOCA's lobbying efforts to convince TxDOT to build a one-of-a-kind and first-of-its-kind freeway expansion project with enhancements.

BOCA Funds Tree Trimming at Poe

In late December and early January, street trees around Poe were professionally trimmed. The goals of the project were to raise the tree canopy to prevent damage by trucks and to eliminate dead wood that posed a hazard to school children and pedestrians. The cost of the project was split between the BOCA Tree program and the Poe PTO.

In the early 1990s, Trees for BOCA planted several dozen trees around the school where the original older trees had died. These trees have now grown into mature specimens, but they have been in need of attention for some time.

BOCA is proud to be able to participate in this project with Poe. Dozens of generous residents of Boulevard Oaks contributed to this worthwhile project.
