#### 1701 Banks Street Has Sold! Thank You to Our Generous Neighbors!



We are overjoyed to announce that the deal to purchase the 1701 Banks Street property has closed. The sale has prevented the construction of the proposed 14,000 square foot, 15+ bedroom, 19-bathroom Study Center/ Dormitory structure (with only two parking spaces) at the corner of Banks and Dunlavy streets. An anonymous buyer in the neighborhood, who is interested in preservation of the neighborhood and its historical single-family character, funded more than 90% of the purchase. The difference was funded by more than 120 Boulevard Oaks donors. The buyer will sign strengthened deed restrictions and will then sell the property as a single-family home site. In the event the buyer is able to sell the property at a net price above the amount at which the buyer contributed to the purchase, the buyer has committed to returning any excess funds to donors.

Now that the deal has closed, the next step is strengthening the West Edgemont deed restrictions. A real estate lawyer has been engaged to draft updated restrictions, which will be circulated and adopted in the coming months. We are also working to ensure the other Boulevard Oaks subdivisions have restrictions that are up to date and to prevent a similar situation from happening elsewhere in the neighborhood.

Thank you very much to everyone who contributed to this successful project. This was a team effort. It would not have been possible without the many civic-minded, caring, and committed people who live in and are devoted to our neighborhood. In addition to the many neighbors who financially contributed to this effort, special thanks go to BOCA board member Andrew McCain for his work as the BOCA architectural control advisor and for coordinating the transaction; to board

member Allison Brooks for coordinating fundraising and communications efforts; to board member Bob Wright for his real estate and strategic advice; to Exec. Director Evalyn Krudy for organizing and managing this project and for all that she does; and to Sue Payne, Jean and Rick Jenner, and Mary and Eugene Alford for very generous anchor contributions and for hosting successful fundraisers; to Elaine & Alan Mut, Lauren Lampton & Peter Coladarci, Mike Clark & Sallie Morian, and Alfredo & Elisa Garcia for very generous anchor contributions; and to all of the neighbors who have devoted their time and energy to this project.

The patrol relies on quarterly voluntary subscription from neighbors in Boulevard Oaks, Southampton, and the Extension. If you are new to the neighborhood, you may not be aware that you can call the patrol to report suspicious persons or have them serve as the first responder for alarm calls, rather than HPD. Patrol officers are almost always nearby, and can arrive much faster than the police. April is the beginning of a new patrol quarter and bills will be sent out soon. #### Trees Preserved at Sunset Boulevard Apartment Project




The 40-unit apartment building at 1730 Sunset Boulevard being built by Morningstar Construction & Development (MCD) is well underway. As of March 2024, the underground garage and first floor deck are complete.

Our thanks to MCD for working with BOCA to revise their plans to preserve as many street trees as possible. The original design called for two 35-foot-wide driveways that would have eliminated three of the street trees in the right-of-way, but MCD leaders found an alternate solution and narrowed the driveways so that only a single street tree needed to be removed. That tree will be replaced with a new one when construction wraps next year.



## **Cherokee at Sunset Intersection Improvements**

We are pleased to announce that with the assistance and persistence of Council Member Abbie Kamin and her staff, working in conjunction with the city's Traffic Division, the dangerous intersection at Cherokee Drive and Sunset Boulevard has been altered to improve the visibility of the stop signs for north-bound and south-bound traffic. Over the years, dozens of major accidents have occurred at this intersection, with many vehicles ending up in front yards.

When this part of the neighborhood was developed in the early 1930s, circular esplanades with live oak trees were included at this intersection and also in the middle of Sunset Boulevard near Rice University's Brown College. Such landscape improvements along with curved streets were the fashion of the time in this formerly suburban part of Houston. Later, in the 1950s and 60s, major car accidents and fatalities forced the removal of the two circular esplanades and trees. Eventually, stop signs were added to area intersections. But due to the inverted corners at Cherokee and Sunset, the stop signs were set back more than 13 feet from Cherokee's curb and, due to parked vehicles and street trees, could not be seen easily by oncoming traffic.



After years of lobbying, we are thankful that this longstanding dangerous situation has been resolved.




#### **City Trash & Recycling Reminders**


- 1) Place leaves and grass clippings in city approved bags at the curb on trash day or have crews haul bags and debris away when servicing your lawn. Loose yard waste should not be dumped into trash or recycling containers.
- 2) When placing bins on the street, maintain at least 3 feet of width between them to ensure proper operation of automated collection equipment.
- 3) Limit on-street parking on trash day and ensure there is enough space between vehicles and bins to allow crews to safely collect trash. Cars' blocking bins may cause missed collection.
- 4) Report Missed Collection to 311 by calling 713-837-0311. The city has 5 business days to return to collect missed trash. It's best to make a report on the same day to help ensure that crews return within the same week.
- 5) Do you have excess trash that won't fit in your bin? "Tags for Bags" stickers can be purchased at local stores.
- 6) Visit www.Houstontx.gov/solidwaste for more information about the city trash and recycling collection.
